MISSION


Daya's mission is to empower South Asian survivors of domestic and sexual violence with culturally specific services and to educate the community to end the cycle of abuse.

A South Asian community in Houston and beyond that is free from family violence.


Impact at a Glance

Crisis Services & Case Management

Trained advocates provide emotional support, safety planning, and resources to help survivors navigate domestic and sexual violence.

Counseling

Licensed professional counselors offer culturally responsive therapy in South Asian languages, addressing trauma while breaking barriers of stigma and access.

Legal Services

Daya provides legal information, connections to trusted partners, court accompaniment, and support throughout the legal process.

Supportive Housing Program

Daya assists survivors with housing options, rental and utility assistance, and access to safe, stable living options.

Employment & Education

Daya empowers survivors with financial literacy, job search assistance, and educational guidance to foster long-term independence.

DAYA'S ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

- Community Engagement: Daya engaged 14,895 individuals across 133 events in Houston and nationwide, delivering prevention trainings, policy sessions, and outreach education. These efforts impacted a diverse range of participants, including community members, faith leaders, law enforcement, college students, volunteers, partner organizations, and elected officials.
- Financial Assistance: Daya provided financial support to low-income families, including \$20,500 for legal assistance, \$174,818 to secure safe housing (covering rent, utilities, furniture, and moving costs), and \$38,406 for essential needs such as food and clothing.
- Client Support Drives: 7 drives conducted with the support of community members and area businesses, who stocked Daya's pantry with South Asian groceries, inclement weather kits, and gift cards.
- Client Workshops: 4 workshops on topics such as communication, financial literacy, health and wellness, auto maintenance, and employment readiness were provided to 30 clients.
- Volunteer Support: 77 volunteers
 contributed their time and skills to assist
 Daya clients with English language
 proficiency and job readiness and provided
 support at Daya events.
